

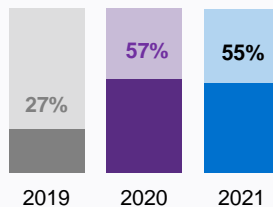
INTRODUCTION

The Medical Training Survey (MTS) is a national, profession-wide survey of doctors in training in Australia. It is safe and confidential and generates profession-wide data that can be used to strengthen medical training in Australia. The MTS is conducted annually with doctors in training, with 2021 representing the third wave of data collection.

METHOD

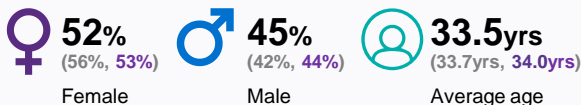
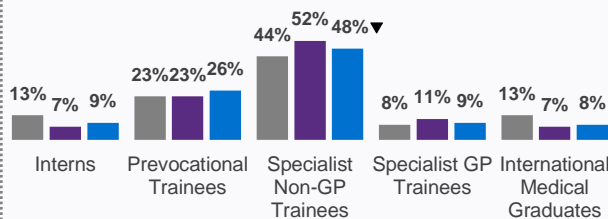
In 2021, n=21,604 doctors in training responded to the online survey, with n=20,671 responses eligible for analysis (i.e. currently training in Australia) between 22 July and 8 October 2021.

RESPONSE RATES



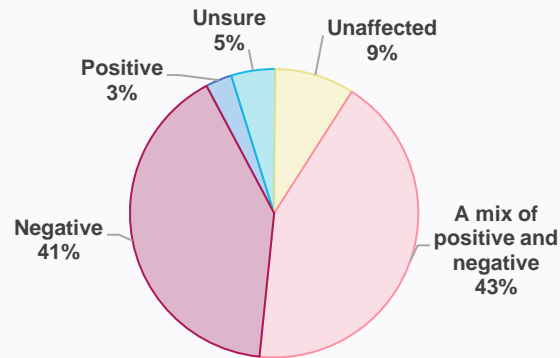
These results have been based on n = 449 doctors in training, working in locations across ACT and compared against 2019 (n = 244) and 2020 (n = 414) results where available.

SAMPLE PROFILE

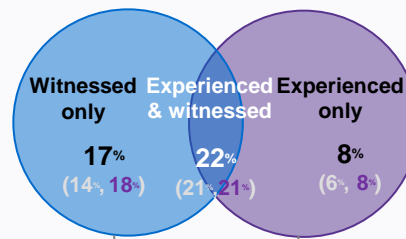


2019 (grey) and 2020 (purple) results in brackets

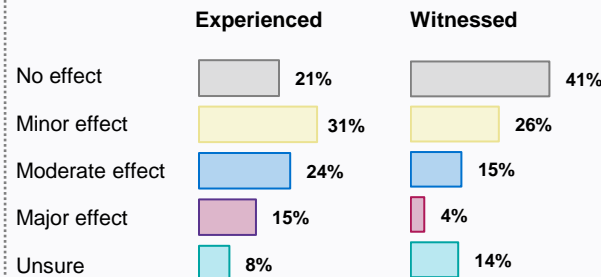


EXPERIENCED AND/OR WITNESSED BULLYING, HARASSMENT AND/OR DISCRIMINATION



Total: experienced and/or witnessed bullying, harassment and/or discrimination 47% (41%, 47%)

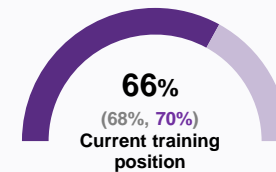

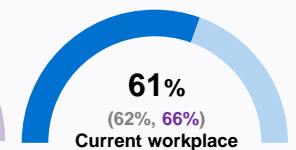

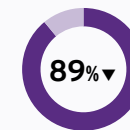
% would recommend current training position to other doctors
