

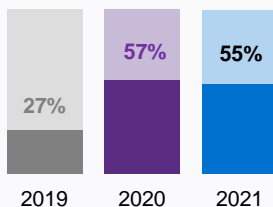
## INTRODUCTION

The Medical Training Survey (MTS) is a national, profession-wide survey of doctors in training in Australia. It is safe and confidential and generates profession-wide data that can be used to strengthen medical training in Australia. The MTS is conducted annually with doctors in training, with 2021 representing the third wave of data collection.

## METHOD

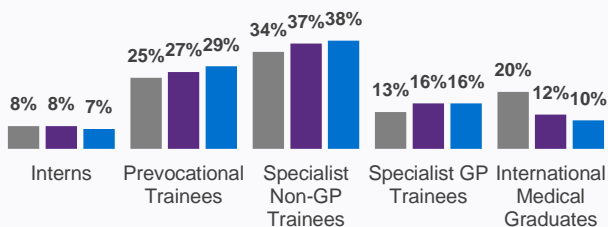
In 2021, n=21,604 doctors in training responded to the online survey, with n=20,671 responses eligible for analysis (i.e. currently training in Australia) between 22 July and 8 October 2021.

## RESPONSE RATES



These results have been based on n = 2,123 doctors in training, working in locations across WA and compared against 2019 (n = 890) and 2020 (n = 2,104) results where available.

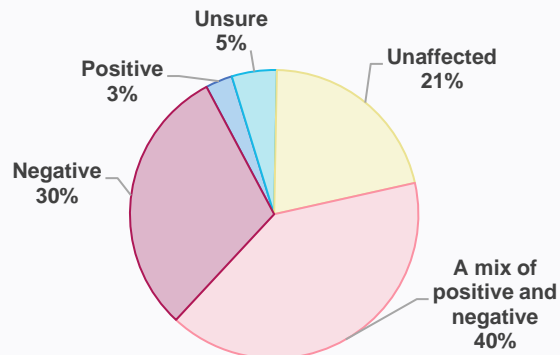

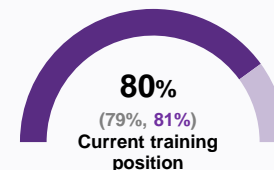

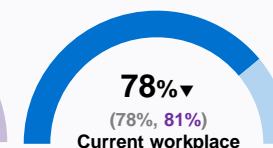

% Total strongly agree/agree

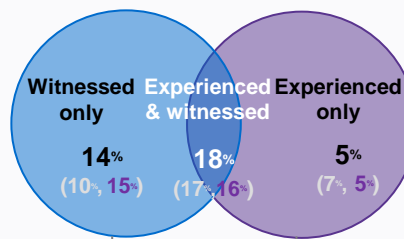
% would recommend current training position to other doctors



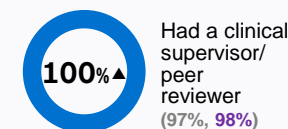
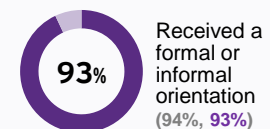
% would recommend current workplace as a place to train

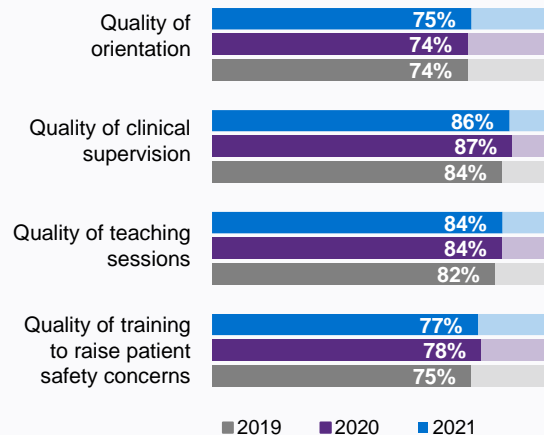
