

Medical Training Survey 2022 Tasmania

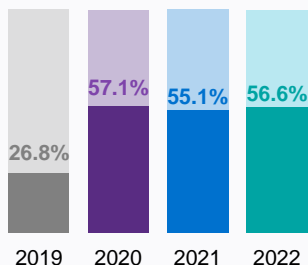
INTRODUCTION

The Medical Training Survey (MTS) is a national, profession-wide survey of doctors in training in Australia. It is confidential and generates data used to strengthen medical training in Australia. The MTS is conducted annually with doctors in training, and 2022 was its fourth year.

METHOD

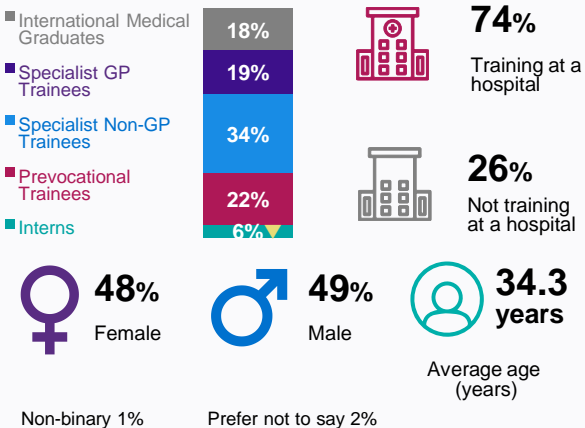
In 2022, 23,083 doctors in training responded to the online survey, with 22,135 responses eligible for analysis (i.e. currently training in Australia) between 28 July and 8 October 2022.

RESPONSE RATES



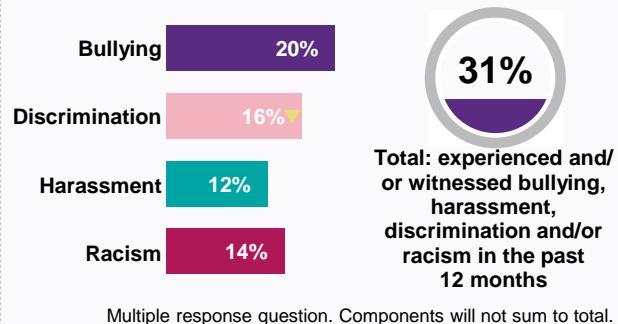
These results have been based on n = 549 doctors in training, working in locations across Tas.

SAMPLE PROFILE

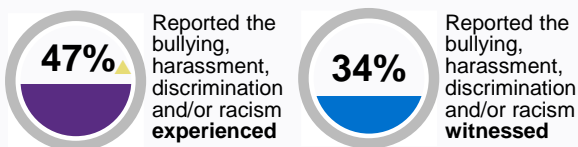


▲ ▼ Significant difference (at 95% confidence level) against 2021 result

REPORTS OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT AND/OR DISCRIMINATION WHILE TRAINING



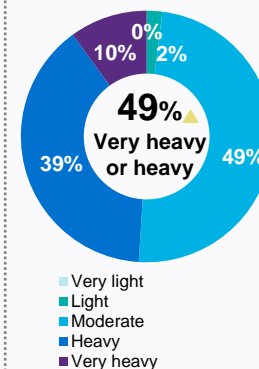
REASONS FOR NOT REPORTING
